

Milo Forest Area

(2280 Jefferson Rd, Manchester, Iowa)

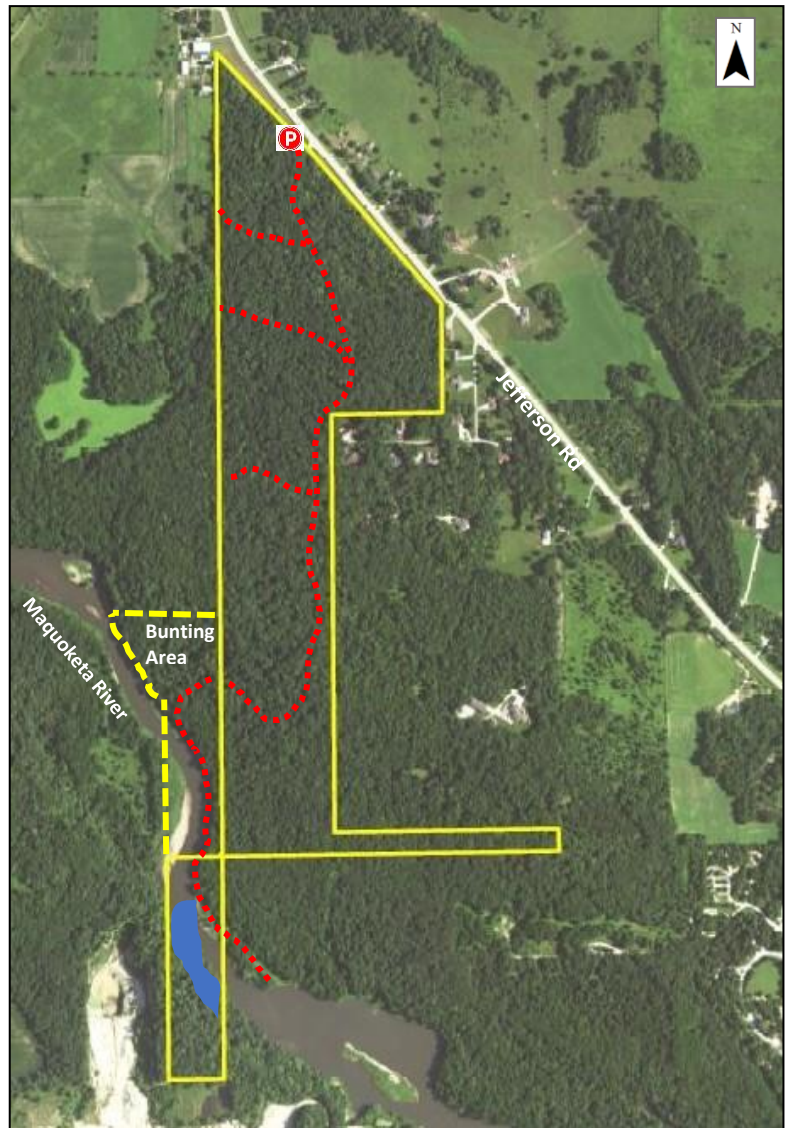
The Milo Forest Wildlife Area is located 2 miles southeast of Manchester in Section 3, 9 and 10 of Milo Township (T88N-R5W) Delaware County Iowa.

This property was acquired by the Delaware County Conservation Board in April of 1961. Their acquisition of 100 acres consisted of heavy forest cover with a few small clearings. These small areas were planted to evergreen trees for wildlife cover.

Today the area is managed as a mature timber for woodland wildlife such as:

- Deer
- Wild Turkey
- Squirrel
- Rabbits
- Songbirds

The woodland trails provide walk-in access for nature walks, hunting during seasons and access to the Maquoketa River. **Hunting is limited to no solid projectile bullets and no discharge of firearms within 200 yards of buildings inhabited by people or domestic livestock.**
