

February 25, 2020

The Page County Board of Supervisors met in session on this 25th day of February 2020, with Chuck Morris, Alan Armstrong, and Jon Herzberg present. Present from the public was John VanNostrand and Jacob Holmes.

King gave a roads update. He stated blades are out since it is dry. Rock is being hauled. Crews are cutting brush at H Avenue north of J64 east of Northboro, D Avenue, 250th Street, 290th Street, and F Avenue. The new brush mower is being used at Page Center next to the old railroad bed. The shop is cleaning up the snow plow trucks. Morris stated there were questions regarding bids and regarding if a department head can ask for reductions after a bid is made. An individual inquired about operational costs and the board asked if we could obtain that type of information. It was also brought to Morris's attention that there is a pipe on 160th Street that has been marked for over five years. He stated he would like to see more pipe work completed. Morris does not think the current plan to fix these pipes is aggressive enough. Morris thinks we need to be strategic to address the problem. Herzberg stated Marion Mellencamp would like some rock on Quincey Avenue and 180th Street.

On a motion by Armstrong, seconded by Herzberg, the board moved to approve the liquor license for River Market 190.

Sheriff Palmer, Jenn Sands, and Charles McCalla met with the board to discuss the performance pay increase for Jenn Sands. Palmer would like to increase her salary by \$500. Her salary would increase from \$41,500 to \$42,000. On a motion by Armstrong, seconded by Herzberg, the board moved to approve the \$500 salary increase for Sands. Herzberg, aye, Morris, aye, Armstrong, aye. Motion carried 3 to 0.

Keith Wagoner and Angie Dow joined the meeting. On a motion by Armstrong, seconded by Herzberg, the board moved to approve the letter to be sent to the landowners of Drainage District 10.

On a motion by Armstrong, seconded by Herzberg, the board moved to approve the minutes from February 25, 2020.

With no further business, the board adjourned at 10:30 am and will meet again Tuesday, March 3, 2020.
