Cedar County Public Health provides home health and community-based services and is certified through the Iowa Department of

Inspections and Appeals. Cedar County Public Health provides compassionate and highly qualified staff to care for your needs. Our staff includes registered nurses, home health aides, and physical, occupational and speech therapists.

Services provided include:

- ◇ Skilled Nursing
- ◇ Homemaking
- ◇ Personal Cares
- ◇ Respite

Skilled Nursing Services

(Provided under the supervision of physicians, podiatrists, or doctors of osteopathy)

- Home safety evaluations and training
- Medication instruction/management
- Wound care management and ostomy care
- Catheter care
- Assistance with walking (i.e. gait problems, weakness, and frequent falls)
- Health observation, assessment, and monitoring (i.e. blood pressure, temperature, pulse, etc.)
- Congestive heart failure management
- Laboratory blood draws
- Health information & assistance to understand a diagnosis or treatment
- IV therapy
- Specimen collection

Homemaker Services

- Light housekeeping
- Household organization
- Meal planning assistance
- Food preparation
- Budgeting assistance
- Occasional transportation within the county
- Laundry assistance

Personal Care Services

- Assistance with activities of daily living such as bathing, dressing, hair care, skin care
- Application of elastic stockings
- Non-sterile simple dressing changes
- Assistance with transfers & ambulation
- Assistance with rehabilitation and exercise therapy

Respite Services

(Funded through Heritage Agency on Aging, Veterans Administration, or private pay)

- Scheduled non-medical visits lasting 1-6 hours
- Home safety evaluations and training
- Temporarily relieve caregivers of responsibility for providing care
- Assist caregivers to enable a person to stay at home
- Provide appropriate care and supervision to protect a person's safety
- Attend to basic self-help needs that would ordinarily be performed by the caregiver
