Pre-registered voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a regular ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters changing precincts must also provide proof of residence. A voter who is unable to provide an approved form of identification (or prove residence if required) 1) may have the voter's identity/residence attested to by another registered voter in the precinct, 2) prove identity and residence using Election Day Registration documents, or 3) cast a provisional ballot and provide proof of identity/residence at the County Auditor's Office by Noon on Thursday, November 10, 2022. Election Day Registrant attestors must provide an approved form of identification. Iowa Code Section 49.31 requires that candidate names be rotated amongst all precincts. Therefore, placement of candidate names may be in a different order in your precinct than on this publication.

Voters can start in-office absentee voting beginning October 19, 2022 to November 7, 2022 from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM. in the Iowa County Auditor's Office. Also, the Iowa County Auditor's Office will be open for in-office absentee voting on Saturday November 5, 2022 from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

Constitutional Amendment -1

- Shall the following amendment to the Constitution be adopted?

Summary: Provides that the right of the people of Iowa to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed. The sovereign state of Iowa affirms and recognizes the right to keep and bear arms as a fundamental right. Any and all restrictions of this right shall be subject to strict scrutiny.

Full Text:

Article I of the Constitution of the State of Iowa is amended by adding the following new section: Right to keep and bear arms. Sec. 1A. The right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed. The sovereign state of Iowa affirms and recognizes this right to be a fundamental individual right. Any and all restrictions of this right shall be subject to strict scrutiny,
